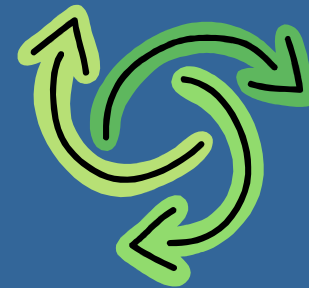

Dauphin County Recycling Center

The Dauphin County Board of Commissioners through its Department of Solid Waste Management & Recycling opened the Dauphin County Recycling Center in April 2009. The Center was established to offer a convenient drop off location for residents, out-of-county residents, and local businesses to recycle their unwanted or obsolete electronics; as well as providing a confidential document shredding service.

Dauphin County began sponsoring one-day drop off events to collect electronics for recycling in September 2001. Throughout the years, the County realized the greater need for the proper disposal and recycling of electronics, and has been able to establish a permanent drop-off Center with grant funding from the PA Department of Environmental Protection.



Why recycle your electronics?

Advances in technology for all electronic equipment, particularly computers, soon renders them obsolete. The average lifespan of a computer is about 2-3 years. Items that break are often not repaired due to the relatively low price of replacement equipment. When the equipment breaks or becomes obsolete, it is sometimes discarded into the waste stream. However, given the sheer volume of obsolete electronics and the potentially hazardous materials they contain, consumers are strongly encouraged to seek environmentally safe recycling when their electronic equipment reaches the end of its useful life.



WHY ARE THEY POTENTIALLY HARMFUL?

Electronic equipment contains metals that, if not properly managed or contained, can become hazardous wastes. **Cadmium** - The largest source of cadmium in municipal waste is rechargeable nickel-cadmium (NiCd) batteries. **Lead** - Monitors and televisions contain a picture tube known as a cathode ray tube (CRT). The CRTs contain leaded glass, and are the largest source of lead in municipal waste. **Mercury** - Some electronic equipment also contains recoverable quantities of mercury.

Why shred your confidential documents?

It's quite simple. To protect your privacy, whether it's personal or business.

Dauphin County Residents

Dauphin County residents, with proof of identification, can recycle their personal electronic equipment **FOR FREE**. Limited to five items per month.

Out-of-County Residents

All residents that live outside of Dauphin County are permitted to recycle their electronics at the Dauphin County Recycling Center. **FEE SCHEDULE DOES APPLY** (see reverse side for current rates).

All transactions must be handled by cash, personal check or money-order at the time the items are dropped off for recycling.

Local Businesses

All local business are permitted to recycle their electronics at the Dauphin County Recycling Center. **FEE SCHEDULE DOES APPLY** (see reverse side for current rates).

All transactions must be handled by cash, corporate check or money-order at the time the items are dropped off for recycling.
