I. ACTION ON ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS, SUBDIVISIONS AND LAND DEVELOPMENT PLANS

1. Ordinance 18-09 – An Ordinance authorizing the placement of a stop sign on Crooked Hill Road for Northbound and Southbound traffic at the intersection with Deer Path Road. (Ward 8)

- 2. CHERRY ORCHARD PLACE A Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for the purpose of constructing a 3-story, 51 unit senior living apartment building. The property is located on Cherry Orchard Drive across from Blue Mountain Commons. The property contains 3.29 acres and is zoned BOR, Business-Office-Residential. The Plan was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission contingent on the approval of the following waivers:
 - 1) 22-402 Preliminary Plan Requirement
 - 2) 22-1102 Monuments and Markers

The Planning Commission attached the following conditions for approval of the Plan:

- 1) Add a note to the Plan that residents must be restricted at least 62 years of age.
- 2) Provide a lighting plan for the site.
- 3) Satisfy the remaining HRG, Dauphin County and Township Staff comments. (Ward 9)
- 3. **BURGER KING** A Preliminary/Final Subdivision and Land Development Plan for the purpose of subdividing an existing 13.19 acre parcel into two separate lots. Proposed Lot #6 will contain 1.1 acres and contain the proposed Burger King restaurant. The property is zoned CH, Commercial Highway. The building will be approximately 2,800 square feet with a drive thru window. Residual Lot #1 will contain 12.09 acres and be subdivided/developed in the future. The Plan was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission contingent on the approval of the following waivers:
 - 1) 22-404 Preliminary Plan Requirement
 - 2) 22-1102 Monuments and Markers
 - 3) 22-1107 Sidewalks

The Planning Commission attached the following conditions for approval of the Plan:

- 1) Directional signage should be added to the Plan to deter customers from directly accessing this property from Turkey Hill. All access should be to/from Dodson Court.
- 2) Satisfy the remaining HRG, Dauphin County and Township Staff comments. (Ward 7)
- 4. <u>COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ASSOCIATION OF PENNSYLVANIA</u> A Request to reduce Site Improvement Guarantee #2 for the County Commissioners Association of Pennsylvania on Sturbridge Drive from \$28,336.00 to \$4,356.00. The Township Engineer reviewed the request and recommended approval. (Ward 9)
