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UNION DEPOSIT SIDEWALK BECOMES A REALITY



State Legislators, Dauphin County Commissioners and local leaders broke ground on the project on June 4, 2018. The sidewalk, from the intersection of Union Deposit Road and Shield Street heading east to the Lower Paxton Township line, links residential areas of Susquehanna Township, Penbrook, and Harrisburg to stores and restaurants along the Union Deposit commercial corridor. The project was a major safety improvement as pedestrians have been walking in the travel lanes of Union

Deposit Road for years. With the continued growth and development along Union Deposit Road, residents were seeking safe, walkable access to their places of employment, bus stops, and local shopping and dining.

The project includes 2,400 feet of new sidewalk constructed to meet current American with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The design includes slope treatments, railing or fencing, and/or retaining wall(s) as the ground drops away throughout the majority of the project area.

The sidewalk project was the recipient of more than \$750,000 in state and county grants. The first, a Dauphin County-authorized Local Share funding (gaming) grant for \$172,000, provided required

- Tom Pyne Ward 5 Commissioner "seed money' for the two state contributions of \$300,000 each. Those were multi-model grants authorized through PA Act 89, which was signed into law nearly five years



ago. State Representative Sue Helm, who supported passage of Act 89, lobbied successfully for the two state grants. One was awarded through PennDOT, and the other was awarded through the Department of Community and Economic Development.

In addition to the sidewalk, the project also included pedestrian signal enhancements at the main crossing between Union Square and Dauphin Plaza shopping centers.



#### **BUILDING CODES AND PERMITS**

Thinking of remodeling or adding an addition to your home? The Susquehanna Township Community Development Department can help you navigate your way through.



#### STEPS FOR APPLYING FOR A PERMIT:

#### 1. Determine if the project requires a permit:

• Permits are not required for: painting, installing cabinets, flooring, installing new siding material, gutters, downspouts, replacement windows/ doors (in the same opening if the framing is not altered), installation of additional rolled or batt insulation, replacement of existing electrical devices with approved devices, communication wiring and/or wireless devices, repairs to plumbing leaks not requiring structural changes, replacing an existing faucet or sink, clearances of stoppages and replacement of existing appliances.

#### 2. If a permit(s) is required, things to consider:

- The type of project determines whether approval is required under the Building Code, Zoning Ordinance, Health Code or all three. <u>Township staff should be</u> <u>consulted in the planning stage to determine the</u> <u>permit requirements.</u>
- Projects that do not require building permits may require zoning permits. These projects would include fences, certain accessory structures under a certain size, new or expanded driveways, gazebos, etc.
- Some projects may require separate electrical and plumbing permits.
- A permit to convert from one heating source to another requires a permit. The manufacturer's installation and operation specifications must be submitted with the permit application.
- The installation of solar panels on a roof requires a structural engineer to provide verification that the roof can support said additional loading. Electrical plans are required as well.
- Obtain the applicable permit application(s) at the Township Building or online at: www.susquehannatwp.com.

# 4. Submit a completed application to the Township Office.

- A completed application includes two sets of complete plans (Residential plans must be a minimum of 11" x 17" in size) including specifications and a plot (site) plan.
- **5. Application will be reviewed by Township Staff.**Reviews can take up to 15 business days, so plan accordingly.
  - Projects may also require approval under provisions of other Township Ordinances and State requirements

- Residential plan review and inspections (except for electrical) are performed by the Building and Zoning Office. Certified Third-party Inspection Agencies perform electrical plan review and inspections.
- Projects requiring variances or special exceptions from the Zoning Hearing Board must receive approval.
- Fees are determined based on the total construction cost of a project. The Township determines the fees.
- NOTE: If other approvals are required, these are separate from the building permit review and should be taken into consideration when planning a project. These approvals must be in place prior to submission. In most cases, all approvals must be obtained in order for building, electrical, and plumbing permits to be issued for a project.

#### 6. Permit is issued

- The Township will contact you when your permit is ready to be picked up and provide you with the amount of fees that are due.
- Your project can begin once the fees are paid and the permit is picked up.
- The Permit must be posted in a visible location on the property.
- 3 days prior to any digging, you must place a PA-1 Call to 811 to have all utility lines marked.

# Requirements for contractors and the rights of homeowners

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania requires various contractors performing home improvement to be registered with the Attorney General's office. Besides the registration requirement, there are regulations affecting contracts, the duties of contractors, and the rights of homeowners. ## **IMPORTANT TOWNSHIP ORDINANCES FOR THE HOMEOWNER**



	Ordinance #	Description	
1	20-104.4c	Trash cans should be put out no sooner than 24 hours before pickup and should be removed from street no more than 24 hours after pickup	
2	10-302	It is unlawful to maintain a motor vehicle that is in disrepair on property.	
3	23-101-105	A permit is mandatory prior to work on a pool. Pools must be at least 8 feet from the side or rear lot lines and structures. Fences are required for all in-ground pools and above-ground pools with a height of 4 feet or less. There are also proper barrier requirements.	
4	Intl Fire Code 307.4.3	Portable outdoor fireplaces must be at least 15 feet from any structure or combustible material. Exception: 1 & 2 family dwellings. Only seasoned hardwood may be burned.	
5	Intl Fire Code 308.3.1	Open-flame cooking devices cannot be used on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of combustible construction. Exception: 1 & 2 family dwellings; or where building/balcony protected by sprinkler.	
6	2-301	Do not allow pet on others' property. Clean up after pet.	
7	2-102	Do not allow pet to run at large in the neighborhood.	
8	25-108	All trimming and pruning of shade trees shall be done in a manner to ensure natural growth and a natural appearance. Dead branches over 2 inches in diameter should be removed.	
9	27-2101	Fences cannot exceed 4 feet in front of property; 6 feet on side & rear of property.	
10	10-101-a	Do not blow grass onto neighbors' property or street. Grass must be maintained at 6 inches or less.	
11	27-2106.4	Outbuildings must be at least 3 feet from property line, 5 feet from alley, 10 feet from house, and cannot exceed 15 feet in height.	
12	25-108	Tree branch clearance must be maintained at 14 feet about street surface and 8 feet above sidewalks.

#### **FALL 2018 LEAF COLLECTION**

The Susquehanna Township Public Works Department will follow the following schedule for leaf pick up this fall beginning on Monday, October 22, weather permitting.

Please follow these guidelines in preparation for the leaf collector:

- Parked vehicles must be moved from the collection area for equipment to move freely.
- On curbed streets all leaves must be raked onto the street adjacent to the curbs.
- On uncurbed streets all leaves must be raked onto the gutter line.
- · Do not cover storm drains with piles of leaves.

#### SNOW REMOVAL

As another winter season approaches, the Susquehanna Township Public Works Department has some reminders:

- · Clearing around mailboxes is the homeowner's responsibility.
- · Wait for the snow plow to pass before clearing mailboxes and driveways.
- · Do not place snow or any other obstruction on the roadway.
- · A path should be cleared around fire hydrants.



#### **FLOODING & STORMWATER MANAGEMENT**

#### INCREASED FLOODING EXPERIENCED IN SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP

Residents in Susquehanna Township were drenched with heavy rains and flooding over the summer. The amount and speed of stormwater has increased as well, resulting in damage to properties and soil erosion.

#### Why is flooding worsening?

- · Increasing amounts of rainfall throughout the year.
  - Large rainfall events have become more frequent along with heavier downpours.
  - Both have increased nationally over the past 30 years.
  - Increase of hurricanes and tropical storms.
- Communities have more paved and developed surfaces resulting in greater amounts of runoff.
- Communities continue to add impervious surfaces at exponential rates.
- Old stormwater systems cannot keep up with new runoff capacities.
- There is a lack of maintenance on the stormwater inlets, basins and swales by property owners.



- Introduce the use of green infrastructure and good stormwater management practices.
- Rain gardens, tree plantings, rain barrels, permeable pavers, and green spaces can increase the amount of area that can absorb rainfall.
- Maintain and clear clogged storm drain inlets, often filled with leaves, sediment and trash.
- Educate yourself on stormwater best management practices and policies.
- Like other surrounding communities that have already done so or intend to do so, the Township is considering the levy of a stormwater management utility fee to provide recurring revenue stream to meet environmental compliance requirements and to fund necessary capital improvements and maintenance to the stormwater system.



# Personnel Spotlight: Kim Sourbeer, Victim and Community Advocate

Kimberly Sourbeer is a crime victim's advocate with Dauphin County Victim Witness (VWAP), providing victim services to Dauphin County residents since 2012. In addition, Kimberly has been an active member of Keystone Crisis Intervention Program for the past 6 years and was previously a member of the Victim Offender Dialogue Program. The purpose of VWAP is to reduce the trauma of a crime by assisting crime victims, witnesses, and significant others to rebuild their lives through advocacy, support, information, and referrals.



Since 2016, domestic violence victims can begin the Protection From Abuse paperwork at the Police Department. Victims or witnesses who are in danger if they testify can be offered relocation services; referrals can be made to mental health drug and alcohol counseling, therapy, and support groups. Additional services offered include offender release notification, address confidentiality program, court notifications, and victim's compensation assistance program. #### **DOOR TO DOOR SALES - FAQS**

Sales people who go door-to-door in the Township are required to have a Solicitation Permit for transient retail sales. Below are some frequently asked questions related to the permit:

below are some frequently asked questions related to the permit.		
What is considered transient retail business?	Door to door sales of products or services. Temporary fixed standards are also considered transient retail businesses.	
When can solicitation occur?	Monday –Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to either dusk or 7:00 p.m. (whichever comes first)	
Do solicitors have to renew their permits?	Yes. Solicitation permits are granted for terms of one day, one week, or one month timeframes. Each permit will have a listed expiration date. The maximum amount of time granted is one month.	
Do solicitors have to carry their permit with them?	Yes. Every permit holder should carry their permit with them at all times.	
Can I ask a solicitor to show me their license?	Yes. A solicitor must exhibit a permit upon request. If they refuse, please alert Township officials or the police.	
Are there any requirements for a solicitation permit?	Yes. The applicant must provide a clear background history to the Township.	
Do non-profits, charities, schools, or religious solicitors need a permit?	No. These organizations and their members are exempt from needing a solicitation permit.	
What does a solicitation permit look like?	A permit is a wallet sized piece of paper that will have a license number, name of permit holder with business name, expiration date, and the signature of the Township Secretary/Manager.



#### VETERANS PARK RENOVATIONS ARE COMPLETED

#### SUMMER REGREATION 2018 REGAP



The summer of 2018 will no doubt be remembered as one of the rainiest in recent years. Anyone who worked or participated in the Susquehanna Township Parks and Recreation programs can certainly attest to that.

The two primary programs operated by the Department, Summer Day Camp and Summer Playgrounds, managed their way through numerous rain outs, flooding, and downpours. Through it all, many children of the Township and neighboring municipalities were treated to games, arts and crafts, and field trips to add a little variety to their summer. Over 200 children participated in our programs. We had two "celebrity" visits this summer: Sherry Christian from CBS-21 visited our Day Camp for a feature story and Chris "Handles" Franklin from the Harlem Globetrotters stopped in to see the kids at Edgemont Playground!

The **Summer Day Camp** is operated from Thomas Holtzman Elementary on Linglestown Road. Camp runs for seven weeks, Monday through Thursday. The Camp accepts children ages 5 – 13. Seventeen employees work at the Day Camp along with several Counselors in Training (CITs). A hot breakfast and lunch was provided daily thanks to the Dauphin County Vo-Tech Summer Feeding Program. The little ones were treated to several field trips: Hands-on-House, Hershey Story, and Gamut Theatre. They also joined the full camp for the annual trek to Lake Tobias. This trip turned out to be the nicest day of the summer (cool and sunny!) with 2½ weeks of rain to follow! The older campers also went bowling, skating, and golfing. The entire Camp cooled off every Tuesday morning at Wedgewood Pool. In addition, the Camp was treated to visits from Dauphin County Fish and Boat Commission, the Ice Cream Clown and a weekly Zumba session. Day Camp enrollment begins

every March and registration is taken on a weekly basis. There is a basic weekly camp fee with additional cost for field trips.



The **Summer Playground Program** operated from Crown Point, Edgemont, and Veterans Park again this summer. The weather was particularly hard on our playgrounds. All three playgrounds were open, despite the weather, for a variety of games, arts and crafts, and sports. Lunches were also delivered to the playgrounds by Dauphin County Vo-Tech. Field trips this summer included Lake Tobias, mini-golfing, skating, and bowling, along with a Thursday morning trip to Wedgewood. Children ages 8 – 12 are eligible to attend the free playground program. Participants pay only for field trips.

In addition to the Summer Day Camp and Playgrounds, the **Tennis Camp** was also dodging raindrops! Even so, kids ages 6 – 13 were able to get one-on-one instruction on the courts.

The Recreation Department employs approximately 35 workers for our summer programs. Employment opportunities are available for applicants age 16 and over. 

#### **FOCUS ON SENIORS - SERVICES AND INFORMATIVE CLASSES**

The following services and activities are available in the Township for Senior Citizens. Contact information can be found in the box at the end of the article.



**Indian Wheels** is perhaps the most visible senior service in Susquehanna Township. A transportation service for citizens over the age of 60, the Indians Wheels car can be seen all over the Township carrying senior citizens to appointments including doctors, dentists, hair styling and more. The service first began rolling in 1987. In the early years, it was hard to get enough volunteers during the summers and services were suspended. Now, with over 15 drivers, the service runs on weekdays year round. There are over 500 clients registered with Indian Wheels. Volunteers are always needed. Those not wishing to drive are needed in the office to serve as dispatchers. The dispatchers not only communicate with the drivers but set up appointments with clients.

**Meals on Wheels** serves the seniors of the Township by providing meals daily to individuals requiring this service. All the meals are delivered to the Recreation Department daily and then picked up and delivered by volunteers. There are currently 22 clients on the schedule. Since the list has grown so large, the route could be split in half. More volunteers are needed, however, for that to happen. This is a rewarding experience for both the volunteer and the recipient of the meal. For some of the seniors it is a welcome visitor. For those who deliver, many develop friendships. Individuals, church organizations, and service clubs can become a part of those who help Meals on Wheels. Training can be provided if necessary.



**AARP Safe Driving Classes** – These driving classes, taught by a certified AARP instructor and sponsored by the Recreation Department, give those ages 55+ valuable information about newer cars, traffic patterns, and safety tips. Those completing the course earn a certificate that can be redeemed by most insurance companies for a discount on their premium! This is a classroom- only course – no driving test required! Classes are scheduled throughout the year.

**Medicare 101** is a class offered about twice a year by Toyia Plater from Capital Blue Cross. The class is designed to help you understand the basics of Medicare including when to start the process, selecting the best plan, and saving money on your prescriptions.

#### **FOCUS ON SENIORS - STAYING FIT AND ACTIVE**

The following classes and leagues are available in the Township for Senior Citizens. They are designed for seniors wishing to remain active and fit. Contact information can be found in the box at the end of the article.

The **Senior Fitness Class**, now in its 14th year, is designed for seniors interested in maintaining a degree of mobility and motion. It is particularly helpful for those with arthritis and joint diseases, and helps with blood pressure and flexibility. The class was started in 2004 and meets weekly. There is an average of 15 participants. It is taught by certified Arthritis Foundation instructor Dorothy Bangert who has been an instructor since 1979! Participants will not only find the class beneficial physically, but will also enjoy being with other people and just having some fun!

The **Senior Softball League**, started in 1990, is divided into two divisions: Over 55 and 62+, also known as the "Evening League" and "Morning League." When you speak with the two current leaders of the leagues, you really don't have to ask why they're still involved. You can see it in their eyes and hear it in their voices. To be able to play competitively with your peers, enjoy the camaraderie, and stay physically active and fit are invaluable gifts that are given to this hearty bunch each and every time they lace up their cleats. Susquehanna Township boasts being the start of Senior Softball. Other than the larger cities of Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, you will not find this level and quality of competition among senior softball players in Pennsylvania.

The **Morning League**, for players age 62+, currently has six teams with 120 players. The players range in age from 62 to 83. The league is described as "social as well as competitive." Open practices are held two days a week at Edgemont Park. There are some modifications of play, but there is no doubt these guys come to play! The games are umpired by team members and disputes are always settled with a handshake.





The **Evening League**, for ages 55+, calls Veterans Park its home, and is a larger organization with nine teams. Long time Susquehanna Township resident, Tom Donnelly, is credited for the original formation of the league. It began with just two teams and has now grown to approximately 180 players. The league has a 27-game schedule with playoffs following. Games are umpired by American Softball Association officials. The level of play is described as competitive, but even so, the "joy of the game" is what keeps these guys coming back year after year. Several of these players also play on traveling teams that compete in Senior Softball USA tournaments.

## **Two Local Scouts Complete Eagle Scout Projects While Performing Service Projects to Benefit Parks**




