Edgemont Courts Have A New Look!



Thanks to the Chris "Handles" Franklin Foundation, the Edgemont basketball courts have a brand-new look. The Foundation is headed by Edgemont native Chris Franklin, a 1991 Susquehanna Township graduate and a current member of the Harlem Globe Trotters.

On a beautiful Saturday morning in October, the newly renovated Edgemont basketball courts were officially dedicated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony. These are the very courts where Chris honed his skills and went on to become a member of the prestigious Globe Trotters.

Through the Franklin Foundation the courts took on a new look with a new surface, poles, backboards, and rims. At the ends of one of the courts are boldly written the words "THE SAL," the nickname given to these courts by the Edgemont kids who played there "back in the day." The name references the building on the hill that looks over the courts, the former Salvation Army Building.

At the December Board of Commissioners Meeting, President Frank Lynch said it best. "The health and vitality of a community is judged by those who give and invest their time in that community. The real test is when someone grows up in that community and comes back and gives back to that community." The Board of Commissioners presented a proclamation to Chris, offering sincere thanks on behalf of the community. Franklin, who still calls Edgemont "home," humbly and honorably accepted the award from Commissioner Johnson, 3rd Ward Commissioner and Vice President of the Board. He thanked a number of people for their assistance with the project including Bob Reichard, recently retired Recreation Director; Nate Spriggs, Public Works Director; the Public Works Department; and the Susquehanna Township Police Department. Thanks to Chris "Handles" Franklin's generosity, the Edgemont kids can enjoy many years of playing ball at "The Sal."

As a kid, I played on these playgrounds. So, to come back and help fix them up, it's amazing, I wanted to get this project done for a long time. So, to have something complete for the community is a great feeling.

The Susquehanna Township Human Relations Commission: Its Role and Procedures

Ordinance 11-17 established the Susquehanna Township Human Relations Commission on July 1, 2012. The Commission is made up of 9 volunteer members, all residents of Susquehanna Township, who are appointed for a three-year term.

What is the role of the Human Relations Commission?

The role of the Susquehanna Township Human Relations Commission is to investigate and attempt to resolve accusations of LGBT or genetic information discrimination in employment, housing, or use of public accommodations. Susquehanna Township is one of 54 municipalities in Pennsylvania that have passed local LGBT nondiscrimination legislation.

How does the Susquehanna Township Human **Relations Commission differ from PA Human Relations** Commission?

All complaints of discrimination based on race, color, familial status, religious creed, ancestry, sex, national origin, handicap or disability, use of guide or support animals and/or mechanical aids are referred to the state level Commission.

What are the steps to follow after alleged discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or genetic information in Susquehanna Township?

- File a complaint with the Susquehanna Township Human Relations Commission.
- on • The Complaint Form is found website www.susquehannatwp.com; or by visiting the Township Offices, 1900 Linglestown Road.
- The completed Complaint Form may be returned to the Township Office in person, via U.S. mail, fax, or emailed to dkratzer@susquehannatwp.com.
- For assistance, call 717-909-9222.

What are the requirements for filing a complaint?

- · Complaint was filed within 180 days of the alleged discrimination
- Alleged discrimination took place in Susquehanna Township
- · Must not involve a type of discrimination which is under the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission. (see classifications above)

What happens once the complaint is filed and meets the requirements for investigation?

- The Commission will send a copy of the complaint to the respondent accused of discriminatory practices.
- The respondent will have 30 days to respond to the complaint.
- Upon receipt of the response, the Commission will invite the parties to an attempt to mediate the dispute.

What happens if mediation does not resolve the dispute?

- The Commission will proceed to a formal investigation.
- · The investigation may result in a finding of No Cause or one of Probable Cause.
- · A finding of No Cause will result in dismissal of the complaint.
- · A finding of Probable Cause will lead to an attempt to engage the respondent accused of discriminatory practices in discussions to end the discriminatory practice by persuasion, conference, or conciliation.

What are the final steps when attempts to resolve the issue fail?

The Commission will attempt to end the discriminatory practice by persuasion, conference, or conciliation. When these efforts fail:

- The Commission will proceed to hold a Public Hearing regarding the complaint.
- After hearing evidence at the Public Hearing, the Commission will determine if a Finding of Unlawful Discrimination should be rendered.
- If it is so determined, the Commission has the authority to order the Respondent to cease and desist the discriminatory practices and order remedies available to the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission under the Human Relations Act.

Building Codes and Permits

Thinking of remodeling or adding an addition to your home? The Susquehanna Township Community Development Department can help you navigate your way through.



Steps for applying for a permit:

1. Determine if the project requires a permit:

 Permits are not required for: painting, installing cabinets, flooring, installing new siding material, gutters, downspouts, replacement windows/ doors (in the same opening if the framing is not altered), installation of additional rolled or batt insulation, replacement of existing electrical devices with approved devices, communication wiring and/or wireless devices, repairs to plumbing leaks not requiring structural changes, replacing an existing faucet or sink, clearances of stoppages and replacement of existing appliances.

2. If a permit(s) is required, things to consider:

- The type of project determines whether approval is required under the Building Code, Zoning Ordinance, Health Code or all three. Township staff should be consulted in the planning stage to determine the permit requirements.
- Projects that do not require building permits may require zoning permits. These projects would include fences, certain accessory structures under a certain size, new or expanded driveways, gazebos, etc.
- · Some projects may require separate electrical and plumbing permits.
- A permit to convert from one heating source to another requires a permit. The manufacturer's installation and operation specifications must be submitted with the permit application.
- The installation of solar panels on a roof requires a structural engineer to provide verification that the roof can support said additional loading. Electrical plans are required as well.
- Please take note that the State Legislature has adopted the 2015 Codes with amendments on October 1, 2018 to the Uniform Construction Code (UCC).Information can be found on the Labor and Industry website www.dli.state.pa.us under the Uniform Construction Code section.
- 3. Obtain the applicable permit application(s) at the Township Building or online at: www.susquehannatwp.com.

4. Submit a completed application to the Township Office.

· A completed application includes two sets of complete plans (Residential plans must be a minimum of 11" x 17" in size) including specifications and a plot (site) plan.

5. Application will be reviewed by Township Staff. Reviews can take up to 15 business days, so plan accordingly.

- Projects may also require approval under provisions of other Township Ordinances and State requirements.
- · Residential plan review and inspections (except for electrical) are performed by the Building and Zoning Office. Certified Third-party Inspection Agencies perform electrical plan review and inspections.
- Projects requiring variances or special exceptions from the Zoning Hearing Board must receive approval.
- Fees are determined based on the total construction cost of a project. The Township determines the fees.
- NOTE: If other approvals are required, these are separate from the building permit review and should be taken into consideration when planning a project. These approvals must be in place prior to submission. In most cases, all approvals must be obtained in order for building, electrical, and plumbing permits to be issued for a project.

6. Permit is issued


- The Township will contact you when your permit is ready to be picked up and provide you with the amount of fees that are due.
- Your project can begin once the fees are paid and the permit is picked up.
- The Permit must be posted in a visible location on the property.
- 3 days prior to any digging, you must place a PA-1 Call to 811 to have all utility lines marked.

Requirements for contractors and the rights of homeowners

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania requires various contractors performing home improvement to be registered with the Attorney General's office. Besides the registration requirement, there are regulations affecting contracts, the duties of contractors, and the rights of homeowners. 	Ordinance #	Description
1	20-104.4c	Trash cans should be put out no sooner than 24 hours before pickup and should be removed from street no more than 24 hours after pickup
2	10-302	It is unlawful to maintain a motor vehicle that is in disrepair on property.
3	23-101-105	A permit is mandatory prior to work on a pool. Pools must be at least 8 feet from the side or rear lot lines and structures. Fences are required for all in-ground pools and above-ground pools with a height of 4 feet or less. There are also proper barrier requirements.
4	Intl Fire Code 307.4.3	Portable outdoor fireplaces must be at least 15 feet from any structure or combustible material. Exception: 1 & 2 family dwellings. Only seasoned hardwood may be burned.
5	Intl Fire Code 308.3.1	Open-flame cooking devices cannot be used on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of combustible construction. Exception: 1 & 2 family dwellings; or where building/balcony is protected by sprinkler.
6	2-301	Do not allow pet on others' property. Clean up after pet.
7	2-102	Do not allow pet to run at large in the neighborhood.
8	25-108	All trimming and pruning of shade trees shall be done in a manner to ensure natural growth and a natural appearance. Dead branches over 2 inches in diameter should be removed.
9	27-2101	Fences cannot exceed 4 feet in front of property; 6 feet on side & rear of property.
10	10-101-a	Do not blow grass onto neighbors' property or street. Grass must be maintained at 6 inches or less.
11	27-2106.4	Outbuildings must be at least 3 feet from property line, 5 feet from alley, 10 feet from house, and cannot exceed 15 feet in height.
12	25-108	Tree branch clearance must be maintained at 14 feet above street surface and 8 feet above sidewalks.

Summer 2019 Street Sweeping Schedule:

- <u>Beginning June 3</u>: The even-numbered address side of the street will be swept the day following trash collection. This is being done recognizing the likelihood of residual debris (small amounts of trash and potential spills) being left on the street following trash collection.
- On the following week, beginning June 10, the odd-numbered side will be swept. The even and odd sides pattern will continue throughout the summer.
- Sweeping season ends 3:30 pm on September 27.

*Please note: The following changes in the alternate week schedule:


- No sweeping will occur on Thursday, June 27; sweeping will be done on Wednesday, June 26.
- No sweeping on the week of July 29 (Sweeper Maintenance).


Remember to Get Your Septic Tank Pumped and Inspected

Susquehanna Township residents who utilize a septic system instead of public sewer must have their septic tanks pumped every three years by an approved sewage hauler (a list is available on our website). Once the tank has been pumped, the property owner OR the hauler must send a completed hauler manifest to the Township. While this requirement is mandatory, maintaining a septic system ensures it functions properly and raw sewage doesn't pollute the Township's streams and ground.



How to Have a Stormwater-Friendly Lawn

A "stormwater-friendly" lawn is one that can absorb rainwater and does not harm local streams due to the over application of chemicals. The steps below will not only help protect local streams and rivers but can result in direct and substantial cost savings for residents.



Grass Height

Set mower height at 3-3.5" to keep grass strong and shade out weeds. Taller grass equals longer roots, which absorb more water.



Grass Clippings

Sweep grass clippings back onto the lawn to prevent them from washing into storm drains. Grass clippings can clog storm drains, which may result in street flooding.



Grasscycling

Retain and spread grass clippings on your lawn. The clippings decompose quickly, provide important nutrients for your lawn, settle to create an organic layer on the soil that encourages stormwater infiltration, and can reduce fertilizer needs.




Minimize Fertilizer Impacts

If needed, only fertilize once a year, typically in September. Use non-phosphorus, "slow release" fertilizer in the amount directed. Keep fertilizer at least 25 feet from a stream and sweep up any spills, putting the product back onto the lawn.




