SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP AUTHORITY

RESOLUTION FURTHER AMENDING SECTION XV OF THE RULES, RATES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP AUTHORITY REGARDING INDUSTRIAL WASTEWATER CONTROL

WHEREAS, Susquehanna Township Authority (hereinafter, "Authority") has in existence certain rules, rates and regulations for the operation and maintenance of the sewer system of Susquehanna Township by the Susquehanna Township Authority which rules, rates and regulations, duly adopted by the Susquehanna Township Authority, as amended from time to time, do specifically provide rules regarding industrial wastewater control being Section 15.01 of the Rules, Rates and Regulations (hereinafter "Regulations") which Section in turn incorporates by reference thereto all ordinances, rules, rates and regulations of the City of Harrisburg relating to said subject of industrial wastewater control; and

WHEREAS, the City of Harrisburg previously enacted by Bill No. 34 of 2007 amendments to the City of Harrisburg's US EPA pre-treatment ordinance regarding industrial wastewater control all in conformance with federal pre-treatment programs and upon request of the Susquehanna Township Authority by Resolution No. 2008-05 did amend its regulations consistent with the pre-treatment program ordinance amendments of the City of Harrisburg; and


WHEREAS, the City of Harrisburg has now enacted by Bill No. 1 of 2010 of the City of Harrisburg certain further amendments to the City of Harrisburg's US EPA approved pre-treatment ordinance concerning industrial wastewater control and has again requested the Susquehanna Township Authority to conform its regulations consistent with the pre-treatment program ordinance amendments of the City of Harrisburg; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the Authority does hereby resolve as follows:

1. Section XV, Industrial Wastewater Control, Section 15.01 of the Regulations of the Susquehanna Township Authority is amended by updating the regulations for pre-treatment of industrial wastewater control by accepting and adopting in their entirety the City of Harrisburg ordinance amendments adopted to Bill No. 1 of 2010, a copy of which Bill No. 1 is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
2. In the event any provisions, sections, sentence, clause or other part of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not effect or impair any remaining provision, section, sentence, clause or other parts of this Resolution, it being the intent of the Authority that the remainder of the Resolution shall be and shall remain in full force and effect.

3. The introductory paragraphs shall become a part of this Resolution where not inconsistent herewith.
4. All past Resolution or parts thereof inconsistent with this Resolution are repealed.
5. This amendment to the Authority's Regulations shall be effective immediately upon approval by the Authority Board this 2nd day of August, 2011.



An ordinance amending Title Nine, Streets, Utilities and Public Services, Part Five, Sewers and Sewerage, Sections 9-501.1 and 9-501.10 of the of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Harrisburg to comply with both State and Federal pretreatment regulations by adopting additional local limits for wastewater pollutants and by adopting those additions into the definitions and abbreviations section.

WHEREAS, the following amendments to the City's wastewater pretreatment ordinances are mandated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency; and

WHEREAS, the amendments are necessary to protect the quality of the Harrisburg Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility's biosolids and prevent anaerobic digester inhibition; and

WHEREAS, the amendments implement technologically derived discharge limitations in accordance with 40 CFR, Part 403 General Pretreatment Regulations for Existing and New Sources of Pollution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HARRISBURG, AND IT IS HEREBY ENACTED BY AUTHORITY OF THE SAME, as follows:

Additions indicated by underscoring, deletions indicated by [bracketing].

SECTION 1. Section 9-501.1 of the Codified Ordinances is hereby amended as follows

9-501.1 DEFINITIONS AND ABBREVIATIONS

These definitions shall apply throughout Part Five of Title Nine of these Codified Ordinances, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise; other definitions may be found in the Glossary.

"POLLUTION" The man-made or man-induced alteration of the chemical, physical, biological or radiological integrity of water.

"POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYLS (PCBs) T" The sum of Arochlors 1016, 1221, 1232, 1242, 1248, 1254, or 1260.

"PRETREATMENT or TREATMENT" The reduction of the amount of pollutants, the elimination of pollutants or the alteration of the nature of pollutant properties in wastewater to a less harmful state prior to or in lieu of discharging or otherwise introducing such pollutants into the AWTF. The reduction or alteration can be obtained by physical, chemical or biological process, or process changes by other means, except as prohibited by 40 C.F.R. §403.6(d) (dilution).

SECTION 2. Section 9-501.10 of the Codified Ordinances is hereby amended as

follows:

9-501.10 SPECIFIC DISCHARGE LIMITATIONS

(a) No industrial user shall discharge, directly or indirectly, into the wastewater collection or conveyance system any wastewater containing in excess of the following pollutant in milligrams per liter:

87 effectuate these ordinances.
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
90 If any provision, sentence, clause, section or part of this ordinance or the application

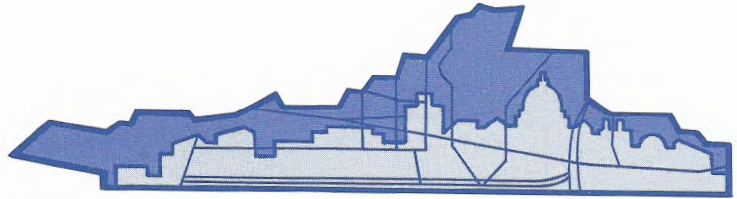

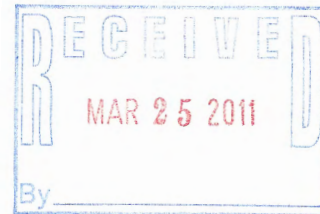
